Cathedrals	The Duomo; Siena; 1196-1215, facade after 1376
Guild Halls and Palazzi del Pubblico	Ypres Cloth Hall; Ypres, Belgium; begun 1200, completed 1620 Rathaus; Gottingen, GR Palazzo del Broletto; Como, IT; 1215 Palazzo Pubblico and the Campo; Siena, IT; 1297-1320's Palazzo Vecchio; Florence, IT; 1299-1314; Arnolfo de Cambio and Loggia dei Lanzi (della Signoria);1376-82

Central America:

La Venta	Southern Mexico, on Gulf Coast; c. 900-400 BCE; Olmec
Teotihuacán	Central Mexico; c. 100 BCE-200 CE; Teotihuacano, (then Aztec) Avenue of the Dead; Pyramid of the Moon; Pyramid of the Sun; Temple of Plumed Serpent Compound; Palace of Quetzalpapalotl
Tikal	Guatemala; c. 300-950 CE; Mayan Great Plaza and Temple I (Giant Jaguar), ca. 700 CE
Chichén Itzá	Mexico, Yucatan Peninsula; c. 800 - 1200 CE; Mayan/Toltec Temple of the Warriors, c.900; Ball Court, 9 th c.
Tenochtitlan	under Mexico City; 1325- 1527; Aztec
