Jerusalem, Israel; 328-36; patron, Constantine and his sons

Church of the Holy Apostles
Milan, IT; ca. 382; plan by St. Ambrose (then Bishop of Milan)

Notre Dame d'Amiens
Amiens, FR; begun 1220

Il Redentore
Venice; 1576-80; Palladio

The Pazzi Chapel
Florence; c. 1430-60; attributed to Brunelleschi

Santa Maria della Consolazione
Todi; c. 1509; attributed to Cola da Caprarola

Benedictine Abbey Church
Weltenburg, Germany; begun 1718; the Asam brothers

San Lorenzo
Turin, IT; 1668-80; Guarino Guarini

Coronaro Chapel and St. Teresa altar
Rome; 1645-52; Bernini
