Versailles, FR; 17th c.; numerous architects; patron, King Louis XIV (the Sun King)

East facade of the Louvre  
Paris; begun 1664; Bernini and Perrault; patron, King Louis XV

Palazzo Chigi/Odescalchi  
Rome; begun 1664; Bernini

Schönbrunn  
Vienna; begun 1695; Fischer von Erlach; patron Crown Prince Joseph

Schloss Pommersfelden  
Pommersfelden GER; begun 1711; Johann Dietzenhofer and others; patron,  
Elector Archbishop of Mainz and Bamberg (Lothar Franz Schönborn)

Stupinigi Hunting Lodge (Palazzina di Caccia)  
near Turin, Italy; 1729-33; Filippo Juvarra; patron Victor Amadeus, King of Sicily

Reggia di Caserta (Palazzo Real)  
Naples, IT; 1751-74; Luigi Vanvitelli; patrons, Bourbon kings of Naples

Blenheim  
Oxfordshire, England; Vanbrugh; begun 1705

Würzburg, GER; 1720-44; Balthassar Neumann and others; patron, Prince-Bishop of Würzburg (Johann Philipp Franz Schonborn)

### Theater in the Munich Residenz

Munich, GER; 1751-53; Franyois Cuvillies

### Nymphenburg Palace

Munich, GER; begun 1633, second campaign 1715-1739; patron, Elector of Bavaria Max Emanuel

Amalienburg Pavilion (on the grounds of the Nymphenburg Palace); 1734-39; Cuvillies

### Dies Wieskirche

Bavaria; 1746-54; Zimmermann brothers
